THEA BUCKLEY COVENOR

Dr Thea Buckley is a Leverhulme Early Career Fellow at Queen's University Belfast, working on 'South Indian Shakespeares: Reimagining Art Forms and Identities'. Thea grew up in India and the USA and has worked for the Shakespeare Institute, British Library, Royal Shakespeare Company, and Shakespeare Birthplace Trust. Publications include the forthcoming co-edited collection *Women and Indian Shakespeares* (Arden Bloomsbury 2021).

Abhaya Simha is a film director and screenwriter from the state of Karnataka, South India. His debut film Gubbachchigalu won the National Award for best children's film, 2008. Jayaraj Rajasekharan Nair (Jayaraj) is a multiple National-Award-winning filmmaker from Kerala, South India. The Berlin Crystal Bear awardee has directed three Malayalam-language Shakespearean film adaptations: *Kaliyattam (Othello), Kannaki (Antony and Cleopatra)* and *Veeram (Macbeth)*. Also an active philanthropist and environmentalist, Jayaraj founded Birds Club International and organizes the Rain International Nature Film Festival.
